


Rozmowa wstępna




- My favourite species of animal is the great white shark. They fascinate me because they are wild and dangerous but also intelligent predators. I'd love to see them up close!







- 1 I think that doctors are paid enough money. They earn a lot, actually. They deserve too, though, because they do an important job. However, I think some doctors should be paid more than others. For example, doctors who perform very complicated surgeries in order to save someone's life or doctors who work in war zones should be paid more because their job involves so much more stress.
- 2 I think medical treatment should be free because people should always be treated if they are ill, whether they can afford it or not. Every one deserves to be healthy so it should be considered a basic human right. It would be ethically wrong to let somebody suffer because they are poor. Everyone should look after themselves properly, though, so that governments can provide a free service. It's not fair that some individuals' medical treatment costs so much when it could have been prevented by better lifestyle choices.
- **3** I think we might have a cure for the diseases we currently know about in the future. Medical science is always advancing and a lot of research is being done all over the world so that we can come up with ways of fighting disease. However, new diseases appear all the time: They evolve and change. So, it's a matter of keeping up. Scientists will have to research new things as they appear so it might be impossible to always have a cure for everything.
- 4 I think going to the doctors is not always the best solution. I think people should be able to judge the level of treatment they need when they are feeling poorly. For example, I would not go to the doctors if I had a sore throat. I would first try and take care of it myself by drinking plenty of water and taking medicine from

the pharmacy. Some people go to the doctors even when there is nothing wrong which wastes time, money and resources.


Rozmowa wstępna

- 1 I think the people could be travelling for lots of different reasons. People fly to other countries for holidays, weekend trips and backpacking but they also travel for family gatherings or business meetings. The men at the front are in suits so they are probably travelling for their work. Some might even be moving permanently to another country.

- I would rather go on a city break because there are more things to do and see. I like shopping, going to the theatre and visiting museums. You can't do any of those things on a camping holiday!



- 1 Yes, very much. They seem to be having fun participating in an active game together. They are probably enjoying being outdoors, socialising in the fresh air and relaxing. They probably prefer it to being indoors in the building behind them. I know I would!
- 2 My environment has a big effect on my wellbeing. For example, if I am stuck inside for too long, I get bored and irritable. Being outside immediately makes me feel calmer and more free. I hate being in small spaces and I hate sitting down for long periods of time. I think the people in your environment affect the way you feel, too. When other people are in a bad mood, it rubs off on me.

Zadanie 3.

The way they have arranged themselves is friendly and I like how the picture focuses mainly on their faces and expressions. They look like a group of nice, normal youngsters who enjoy spending time together. I rejected Picture 1 because I think the picture looks unnatural. They seem to be outside a school building as they have a pile of books next to them. Of course studying is important but I don't think it's what a fashion magazine would focus on. It's unrealistic to think that this is what would appeal to a teenage audience. I rejected Picture 3 because I don't think this is what modern teenagers look like at all. They have chosen clothes that might have been trendy a while ago but they're not fashionable now. The teenagers look more like a band, a gang or a group of models here and not like today's typical teenagers. The way they are standing and their expressions look aggressive and I don't think most teenagers have this kind of negative attitude.

- 1 I think we should only judge people by what they do.
